Why We Are Needed


 Multiple placements in foster care are associated with increased mental and behavioral health problems.

At Amy's, we are creating a community committed to supporting its most vulnerable and their caregivers.


MISSION

Amy's Armoire's mission is to improve outcomes for Vermont foster/adopt/kin children and youth by connecting families to the resources they need.



Although the pink line below shows that sales dipped in the summer of 2023, this was due to flood recovery. However, we had an increase in donations and grants which allowed us to make repairs and improvements and reopen stronger than before the flood.

In 2024, sales increased as we expanded our store mid-year, doubling its size. Revenue looks strong for the 2025 year.



When we started in June of 2021, we were in an 800 square ft. space in a hard-to-find location. Now we have a 3000 square ft. warehouse for donations on Main Street for sorting and storage and a 1200 square ft. Family Center in the same location. In June of 2024, we expanded the retail space right in the heart of downtown Barre on Main Street and were able to hire two part-time employees to oversee the operations of the 3500+/- square ft. retail store that supports it all.

In June of 2024, Robyn was chosen to be our Retail Store Manager because she demonstrated her commitment to our mission as a volunteer since 2022. She is a true leader and models all the values we hold dear. She has a positive attitude no matter how big the challenge. She knows how to find the individual assets volunteers bring to the table and brings out the best in them.

She also brought hundreds of volunteers into our state to help with flood remediation in 2023 and also secured the funding and volunteers Amy's Armoire needed to install new flooring. She participates in the organizing of the annual Night to Shine event for the Special Needs community in partnership with Faith Community Church.



This youth recently called to thank us and celebrate the completion of his probation, because, as he said, "You were there from the beginning."







Through a partnership with the community, we help those in need of clothing due to poverty, flood, fire, homelessness, etc.



\$3,007 of free clothing to...

- 155 individual families
- 17 kids with parents working with DCF
- 8 foster, adopt or kin families
- 20 flood victims
- 9 unhoused individuals
- 7 prom/Night to Shine recipients
- 4 who aged out of foster care

This doesn't count the free items given out straight from the Donation Center to foster, adopt, kin, and birth families. We have no way to track the amount.


EXPANSION




